

Canadians orchestras continue to deepen their connection with audiences and the communities they serve.

To allow us to do this more effectively, we urge the Government of Canada to:

35.8%

Help arts organizations play their part in addressing the climate crisis by ensuring they are eligible for federal programs supporting research and fact-based carbon reduction projects.

Complete the five-year \$180 million investment in the arts through the Canada Council for the Arts in Budget 2020-21.

Enhance the budget of the Endowment Incentives component of the Canada Cultural Investment Fund by \$6.5 million annually, to help arts and culture organizations raise private sector contributions and develop stable, long-term revenues through the growth of endowment funds.

Increase funding and support for internships and on-the-job training for emerging arts managers by \$500,000 annually to enable strong succession, and diversity in the sector.
